Teacher can give tasks to read sentences from exercise they are about to perform and lift one finger up every time they meet an unknown word. If at the end all finger are raised, it might be more suitable for them to work on the assignment with a designed tutor for English as an additional language.

Reading is the most effective way of learning literally skills. Hence the hard work of teachers to develop the reading skills of the students. Some reading activities include pre-reading, skimming, scanning and graded reading.

Pre-reading helps students to know something about the material to be read. This helps the students make assumptions on the material to be read. It will also help the students understand the text and the illustrations in it.

Skimming or scanning is an essential way of analyzing a text. It is the act of reading a text from top to bottom without actually saying the text in your head. Teachers can point out learner how to skim by running their fingers along each

paragraph and looking related vocabulary. Scanning is one of the most fruitful bottom-up strategies in which learners begin from a smaller unit of meaning, in this case word, phrase or sentence level. An addition to this, scanning involves looking for a particular idea or word in a text which is helpful for English as an additional language who are trying to answer a question on an activity sheet.

Another strategy is called graded readers which can help to avoid frustration when students do not know too many words in a reading activity. It demands following along with classroom discussions and enhance their reading skills at the same time.

In conclusion, although there are many ways of effective teaching in the classroom, teacher should choose the most appropriate one according to level of the classroom, also it should be easy to grasp and understandable for students, then we can improve effective English language skills step by step.

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
